I. <u>Minutes of April 5 and April 20 Meetings</u> Moved: Kathy Second: Lenore Approved: all

# II. <u>Enrollment Notification Mailer issues</u>

- **a.** Slight delay in hitting Canterbury mailboxes
  - i. Mail drop was when it went to the post office
  - ii. People started to receive them today (5/3)

# b. "Canterbury.CommunityPowerNH.gov" URL sub-domain disconnect (HH email)

- i. URL is not currently working
- ii. This URL is where people are directed on the mailer
- iii. It is directing to the main Community Power Coalition website, where the link to Canterbury is at the top this should be fine for now
- iv. Will monitor to see if it is fixed expected to be working by Friday (5/5)
- c. Other ways to access new webpage, and Customer Center staffed by Calpine
  - i. "CommunityPowerNH.gov/Canterbury" this URL is still working
  - **ii.** "CommunityPowerNH.gov" and click on "Canterbury Community Power" - this is where the link on the mailer gets you, Canterbury link is right at the top

- iii. Link to "CCP Customer Website HERE!" at Town Web-site CCPC webpage
- iv. Telephone 1-866-603-POWR for Calpine Community Power Customer Rep
- v. Scan the QR Code the QR code is currently working properly
- **d.** How do we get word on how to access website to Canterbury residents?
  - i. We will put explanation in the town email next week if it is still not working
- e. Mailer does not state the location where the public information session is being held on page 3 this was just a typo the location is at least included on the front page of the mailer
- f. NH Electric Co-op version of the mailer (each service area Until, Eversource, NH Electric Co-op – received its own version of the mailer specific to that service area) – there is an incorrect statement on page 1 for NH Electric Co-op customers, stating that Canterbury Community Power is going to benefit them by giving a lower rate than their current supplier
  - i. It could benefit them long term, but not right away
  - ii. NH Electric Co-op residents are not automatically enrolled for this reason
  - iii. We will explain this at the public information session

# III. Break-out of Canterbury Community Power campaign materials

- **a.** Discussed the best locations for the campaign materials that were provided by Community Power Coalition:
  - i. Horizontal Banner: 6' wide x 3' high
    - 1. Would look nice on the Gazebo
    - 2. Howard to check with Ken Folsom
    - **3.** Lenore to meet Howard at 4pm at gazebo 5/4 to hang the banner
  - ii. Vertical Pop-up Banner: 6' tall x 2' wide
    - 1. Hoping to set this up in the library until the public information session
    - 2. Kathy checking with Rachel
  - iii. Sandwich Board: 3' high x 2' wide
    - 1. Not an actual sandwich board would have to be attached to one to display properly
    - 2. Beth has access to one
    - 3. This could be displayed somewhere in the center of town
    - 4. Across the street by the cemetery
    - 5. Outside the Parish House Wednesday (5/10) when we have the public information session
  - iv. Posters: 17" tall x 11" wide
    - 1. Library
    - 2. Store bulletin board
    - 3. Sam Lake house

v. Need to add the time and location of the public information meeting to the signs – Lenore is going to make printouts to put on them

#### IV. <u>5/10 Public Information Meeting at Parish House</u>

- **a.** Lenore is drafting language for the town-wide email hoping to get it in Monday
- **b.** Discussed Slide Deck provided by Henry Herndon
  - i. Are we going to show these at the public information session?
  - **ii.** Probably have them set up, but not necessarily go through them in a formal way
  - iii. Can pull up relevant slides when questions are raised on covered topics
- c. Questions we need to be prepared for?
  - **i.** Beth will MC
  - **ii.** 3<sup>rd</sup> party suppliers Tim
  - iii. Net-metered, NH Electric Co-op Beth
- d. CCPC members should be a little early to set up, 630pm-ish

# V. <u>Other Business</u>

- a. Discussed need for new CCPC Outreach leader
  - i. We do not know what we will need yet after the public information session is complete
  - **ii.** For now, Lenore and Howard will do the town email (as needed) and town monthly newsletter (as needed)
  - iii. If there is no news, do not need to post anything
  - iv. Definitely need an email next week to remind people about the public information session on 5/10
  - v. Monthly newsletter for June reminding people that the meter-read date where service will switch over will be in June
  - vi. Will want to provide a net-metering update decision from PUC regarding net-metering should be forthcoming
  - vii. Discussed a notice in the newsletter to ask people if they want to join the committee
- **b.** Anticipating "commencement of service" on May 30
  - i. Rules say service will commence 30 days from the mailing date
  - **ii.** In this case, the mailing date was Monday, May 1, so the commencement of service date would likely be May 31
  - iii. This does not mean that peoples' service will be switch to Canterbury Community Power on May 31 – it will depend on when the June meterread date is
  - iv. The change will not be pictured on the customer's bill until the July bill
- **c.** Discussed possible change in focus for CCPC after the May 10 public information session

- i. Probably no need for meetings every other week maybe every 1-2 months
- **ii.** Main role will be as support for Selectboard as they need to decide rates, and then a couple years from now, deciding how Canterbury may want to invest its reserves
- iii. Discussed possible collaboration with the energy committee
  - 1. Collaboration would be valuable moving forward to discuss common goals (energy committee, conservation commission, planning board, etc.)
  - 2. Get Canterbury Community Power through startup and first rate change, and then summer months
  - 3. CCPC only should meet in June to discuss a potential joint meeting in the fall late summer to discuss next steps
  - 4. Decided on a Thursday, June 22, 7 pm CCPC meeting
- **d.** Community Power Coalition annual meeting (4/21)
  - i. CPC board was elected
  - ii. Brian Callnan was announced as CEO
  - iii. Representatives from Canterbury can attend all the meetings and will have access to all the information exchanged
