- 7 Absent: Bob Steenson.
- 8 Kelly chaired the meeting. Kelly was in the meeting house. Everyone else attended by zoom.
- 9 Agenda items were taken in the following order:

# 11 **1.** Approval of minutes of the December 8, 2022 meeting.

- 12 Upon motion by Audra, seconded by Ken the minutes were approved as amended
- 13

# 14 **2. Membership and terms.**

- 15 The membership was affirmed with 7 voting members and no alternates. Opportunities to
- 16 invite new members were discussed. A few names were offered and members will follow up.
- 17 We will place a note in the newsletter and town email.

# 19 **3. Control of invasive plants.**

- 20 The commission discussed the next steps toward controlling the invasives at the Riverland
- 21 Conservation Area parking lot. The commission is interested in pursuing a pilot project with
- 22 Doug Cygan. Kelly will ask Doug for an estimate of costs for chemical control. She will also
- 23 mention this to the selectmen. We will need to move the boulders in advance of any treatment.
- 24 Kelly will ask around for a local contractor who may give us a better price. Later in the meeting
- 25 Audra reported on the status of the invasives in the RSFCA fields.

# 26 **4. Deepwood Forest conservation easement public hearing.**

- 27 In anticipation of providing funding for conservation of this 400 acre property, the Commission
- will be holding a public hearing. The February 9<sup>th</sup> meeting was suggested. Kelly will confirm the
- 29 need to have a quorum in person. Members were asked to plan on attending in person to avoid
- any complications. This hearing will require 2 weeks notice. Leah Hart from the SPNHF will be
- 31 present to explain the project and answer questions.

# 33 5. Master Plan

- 34 Kelly attended a meeting of the Planning Board to participate in the discussion about the
- ongoing update of the Master Plan. Kelly reported on three topics which were reviewed. 1)
- 36 Discontinued Roads, 2) The name of the Ag/Conservation zone, which will remain as it is. 3)
- confirming that the CCC comments on Chapters 5 and 6 were forwarded to the Regional
- 38 Planning Commission.
- 39 The Planning Board is anticipating receiving a draft update of the master plan from the Regional
- 40 Planning Commission.

## 42 **6.** Conservation property priority process discussion.

- 43 Kelly shared the list of potential natural resources professionals and others with deep
- 44 knowledge of Canterbury's natural resources. The list now includes 27 people. Email contact
- information is still needed for several people. An email will be sent soliciting their input
- 46 sometime in February.

## 48 **7. CCC report for the Town Report.**

- Ken pulled together a list of our significant efforts and accomplishments in 2022. Kelly will becompiling this into a report to be published in the Town Report.

## 52 8. Easement monitoring reports for 2022

- 53 Ken reported that he had reviewed Chris Kane's easement monitoring reports on properties
- 54 where the Town holds conservation easements. There were no significant issues to report. We
- need to confirm ownership of the Ruesswick/Cook easement off Intervale Road.

## 57 9. On-line Conservation Maps.

- 58 Kelly reported on new and improved map presentation of our natural resources by the Regional
- 59 Planning Commission. She then showed the new improved interactive mapping tool. We can
- now toggle on and off the various data layers. She sent the link to commission members.

## 62 7. Other business.

- Audra reported going to the RSFCA in anticipation of a work day to cut back the invasives. The
- 64 work day did not materialize. Audra reported on the abundance of invasives. Kelly explained
- our management approach of mowing half of the field each year to provide a diversity of
- 66 habitat. Kelly also reported seeing two very large flocks of turkeys in the field recently. No
- 67 progress had been made in removing the piles of large rocks.
