Agenda:

- 1. Call to Order
 - a. The meeting was called to order at 5pm.
- 2. The Selectmen signed an interfund transfer from the operating account to Capitol Reserves as per Warrant Article WA-2023-4.
- 3. Highway Department Bought Truck
 - a. They bought the truck referred to in Warrant Article WA-2023-8. They were able to get it off the lot today, so no wait period for delivery.
- 4. Broken Backhoe
 - a. First discussed in 07-17-2023 Selectmen's Minutes Section 2.d.vi.
 - b. The backhoe is broken and needs to be replaced.
 - c. Ken received two quotes from CAT.
 - i. ~\$190K for one that would arrive in December. It has a manual coupler and would need \$6500 to upgrade it to hydraulic.
 - ii. ~\$198K for one that would arrive in February. It has radial tires, a hydraulic coupler, and larger bucket.
 - d. CAT changed the tires for this model between 2023 and 2024. The one available in February has the new tires and thus would have replacement parts available for longer.
 - e. While we wait for a new one, the Highway Department is trying to rent one. There is a wait for a rental to become available due to the flooding in Vermont and Western New Hampshire.
 - f. By the time the new one arrives, the digging season will be over, so a two month delivery difference won't affect the amount of time with the rental.
 - g. Ken talked to Scott Doherty before the meeting. Scott is in favor of replacing the backhoe and John/Evan can provide their opinion on which quote is better.
 - h. Due to CAT's municipal discount and warranty differences, getting a one year old model would be more expensive than a new one.
 - i. Because this expense was not planned for, we will need to lease it for the first year and then create a warrant article for outright purchase. The lease will cost about \$40K and that is part of lease purchase fund. The funds for the lease can be taken from Capitol Reserve Fund.
 - j. Kent made a motion to purchase the second option that will be completed in January 2024 for ~\$198K. Cheryl seconded. All in favor by roll call, motion carried.
 - k. Ken will contact the salesman and start the paperwork. There will be a contract for the Selectmen to sign at the next meeting.

- 5. Sam Lake Garage Lock
 - a. The lock for the Sam Lake Garage was cut by someone trying to access storage for the Canterbury Fair. A new lock will be placed on the door and keys will be available for both the Town and the Canterbury Fair.
 - b. The current agreement for the building is that the Town uses 50% and the Canterbury Fair uses 50%. There was a non-binding vote at the 2023 Annual Meeting to give the Canterbury Fair 100% of the building.
 - c. The Town's long term plan for that building is file storage. It would allow for ADA compliance and provide space for records that need to be maintained indefinitely.

6. Adjournment

a. Kent made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 5:40 p.m. Cheryl seconded. All in favor by roll call, motion carried.
