OXBOW POND ROAD PARKING REGULATIONS

02011 Regulation #10

KNOW ALL PERSONS BY THESE PRESENTS, the Canterbury Board of Selectmen hereby ordains to adopt these regulations as the rules by which parking on Oxbow Pond Road in the area the entrance to the Riverland Beach access gate shall henceforth be governed.

1.1 AUTHORITY

These Regulations are adopted pursuant to the authority granted to the Towns Governing Body under RSA 41:11.

1.2 PURPOSE

The purpose of these regulations is to promote the safe and orderly use of the Town Beach for the benefit of Canterbury residents, property owners and their guests.

1.3 REPEAL OF PREVIOUS REGULATIONS

These regulations shall supersede and replace all previous Town Regulations concerning parking on Oxbow Pond Road in the vicinity of the Riverland gate.

1.4 RULES

A. Parking

Parking is available, during normal operating hours, at the parking area at the end of the right-of-way onto the Riverland Beach . There is no parking on Oxbow Pond Road at any time. Vehicles parked on Oxbow Pond Road, between the posted "NO PARKING" signs will be towed at the owner's expense, in addition to any other penalties that may be applicable as a violation of these Regulations.

1.5 VIOLATIONS

- A. Failure to comply with any of these Regulations shall be considered a violation subject to penalties set forth herein.

- B. Each continuation of a violation after notice and each rule infraction shall constitute a second offense.

1.6 ENFORCEMENT

- A. These Regulations shall be administered and monitored by the Canterbury Police Department. The authority to administer and monitor shall consist of the following:
 - a. Documenting and reporting violations to the Canterbury Police Department;
- B. These Regulations shall be enforced by any duly certified Law Enforcement Officer. Enforcement shall consist of (1) an order to vacate the premises; (2) the issuance of a citation; (3) demand for restitution; (4) the issuance of a summons; (5) arrest; and/or (6) any combination of these actions at the discretion of the enforcement official based upon the severity and egregiousness of the violations(s).

1.7 FINES AND PENALTIES

- A. Any person who has committed a violation of these Regulations shall be subject to a fine as follows:
 - a. First Offense: The amount due shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25)
 - b. Second Offense: The amount due shall be fifty dollars (\$50)
 - c. Third (or more) Offense: The amount due shall be one-hundred dollars (\$100)
- B. No person who has been issued a violation citation shall be allowed to enter the beach property until such time as the fine has been paid or they have been found not guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction or unless ordered by the Board of Selectmen.
 - c. Failure to make payment of a fine as indicated on the citation within thirty (30) days of issuance shall result in prosecution in Concord District Court. Any person found guilty in a court of law for violating these Regulations shall thereafter not be eligible for access to the beach property for a period of one (1) year from the date of conviction.

1.8 SEVERENCE

In the event that any word, sentence or section of these Regulations is found to be invalid as a result of judicial or legislative action, the remainder of these Regulations shall remain in full force and effect.

1.9 EFFECTIVE DATE

These Regulations shall take effect 6 July 2010.
