I know of 3 possible CE projects brewing in town, and I expect we may get asked to assist at varying levels with each, so I was going to propose that we spend time reviewing our project evaluation criteria and updating if needed. However, searching for the criteria I could only find eval criteria for taking on a CE project ourselves. Since we prefer to have an NGO lead and own the easement, I was thinking we need a simpler scoring sheet to help us decide what's worth spending money to conserve.

As a starting place, I'd include questions such as:

- 1. Is the project in 1 of our 2 highest scoring co-occurence areas?
- 2. Is it in 1 of the 2 highest priority zones for the Merrimack Conservation Plan?
- 3. Is it adjacent to conserved property (either fee or CE or fee)?
- 4. Is it in 1 of the 2 largest categories of unfragmented land?
- 5. Is it in 1 of the 2 highest categories of the Wildlife Action Plan?
- 6. Is it in any area identified in the Master Plan as a priority for conservation?
- 7. Would the project conserve unique, endangered or threatened habitat or species?
- 8. Would the project conserve or buffer any water resources or wetlands?
- 9. Would the project conserve any recreational resources (including trails)?
- 10. Would the project conserve active or potentially productive agricultural land?
- 11. Would the project conserve any important historical resources?

And we'd want a scoring system to go with it. This discussion could be a warm-up to further attempts to set our own conservation priority areas within town (so we could do some proactive work), and I think it would help us be fair in evaluating projects that request assistance and/or deciding how heavily to invest in each. I hope we have time on the agenda for a good workshop discussion on some criteria.
