1.	Minutes of March 23 2021
	Kent Ruesswick moved and Chery Gordon seconded the Minutes. Greg Meeh pointed out a correction for lines 41-2. Add that the Board was going to work on the survey results, liaise with Central Regional Planning, and contact other towns in the upcoming months. The Minutes were voted upon twice, once with those in person attending and then again with other members remotely. All members voted aye. The Minutes were accepted with amendment.
2.	Master Plan – further discussion
	The discussion was started over when it was realized that members wishing to attend remotely were unable to get onto GoToMeeting. Once the phone conference system was activated the discussion resumed with a recap. Kent had spoken with Mike Tardiff of Central Regional Planning. They were hoping to do a zoom meeting with the Board soon. The issue of funding for the Master Plan was raised. Kent will check with Ken Folsom about the funds that would have been spent last year and whether or not they were still available.
3.	<u>Liaison with other Boards and Commissions in town</u>
	Joshua Gordon introduced the documents that Greg Meeh had shared from the CCC Wetlands Setback research from about fifteen years ago. He thought this was a good idea and great research to get started with. A 50 foot buffer was pretty modest. Greg added that Ashley Ruprecht from the CCC was well versed in wetlands matters from work in Laconia and was willing to join the Planning Board to work on this. Joshua suggested Art Rose be invited too. It was agreed that Greg would reach out to Ashley and Joshua would reach out to Art. The next meeting when the discussion could progress would be Tuesday May 11. Joshua will also contact Jim Snyder.
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There was discussion about next steps since all members agreed this was a good proposal. Members considered the pros and cons of using social media as well as informational meetings, and newsletter outreach. Town residents should understand this was all designed to protect their wells and the watershed.

It was agreed that they should gather more information from a session dedicated to wetlands, then write an introduction about the issue for release in town and make opportunities for listening and informing town residents during the year.

## 4. OSI online conference May 15

There are 3 members signing up for this conference on Saturday May 15. Ken Folsom and Jan Stout will take care of giving names and making payment.

## 5. Any Other Business

Greg raised the issue of ADU's (Accessory Dwelling Units). There are dozens of these units in town that are not officially recognized. The Special Exception process is expensive as the cost of an application to the ZBA has risen. Is there some way of bringing people into compliance expeditiously? The fees are a disincentive. Could the town waive the fees for a given period of time? Cheryl agreed to ask at the next Select Board Meeting on Monday.

There being no further issues, Greg made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Joshua, around 8 pm.
