## Annual Meeting Warrant

L. S.

The State of New Hampshire  
To the Inhabitants of the Town of Canterbury in the  
County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to  
vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall,  
said Canterbury, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March,  
at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon  
following subjects:

- Art. 1 To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year  
ensuing.
- Art. 2 To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to  
defray town charges for the ensuing year and  
appropriations of the same.
- Art. 3 To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen  
authority to borrow money in anticipation of tax.
- Art. 4 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate  
\$400.00 for Pine Blister Rust control.
- Art. 5 To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provision  
of the Municipal Budget Act.
- Art. 6 To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid as  
outlined by the State Highway Department.
- Art. 7 To see if the Town shall instruct the Selectmen to  
apply for and accept State Aid to be applied to the extension  
of the black road from the Shaker Village to Hills  
Corner, during the year 1941.
- Art. 8 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen  
to appoint a committee of three persons to determine  
names of such Town roads as have no established names,  
this committee to serve without pay, and make its report  
to the next annual Town Meeting.
- Art. 9 To see if the Town will vote to reduce the board of libra-  
rarians from six to three, by electing one trustee annually  
beginning with the election in 1942.

- Art. 10 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 to lay a hard wood floor in the Town Hall and paint the inside of the Hall.
- Art. 11 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 to repair the Horse Sheds; provided the Selectmen can make a satisfactory agreement with the Church, which will not involve the making of any payment to the Church.
- Art. 12 To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the ~~the~~ road from the corner at the Emery School to the Northfield line.
- Art. 13 To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Amee Road from the Hancock place to the Rocky Pond Road.
- Art. 14 To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the "New Road" so called, from above the Shaker Village, through the Wymane woods, to the Thurston place.
- Art. 15 To see if the Town will vote to allow the Board of Selectmen to appoint instead of elect a clerk of their board.
- Art. 16 To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
